Judy Jolly is probably best known at TCC for her years advising the Talon newspaper. Judy says that what she really enjoyed was helping her journalism students understand the power and responsibility their decisions carried. During her tenure Judy took her students to journalism conferences all over the country: a privilege they were allowed because of the awards they were winning.

Judy herself was presented with the Gold Key Award by Columbia Scholastic Press Association. The Florida Community College Activities Association and Florida Community College Press Association inducted her into their Halls of Fame, and Tallahassee's Women in Communication chapter presented her its Lifetime Career Achievement Award.

Judy started teaching English at TCC in 1968 and retired in 1995. Early on she also developed a science fiction course and helped advise the Eyrle, TCC's literary magazine. As the journalism courses grew, she became journalism chair. She served as president of the steering committee and chair of the faculty senate. Judy served on the Board of Visitors at FAMU's journalism school for over 20 years. Many of her students were awarded scholarships when they transferred to FAMU.

Today Judy remains an active member of the President's Circle. She is extremely proud of TCC and its place in the community.
