

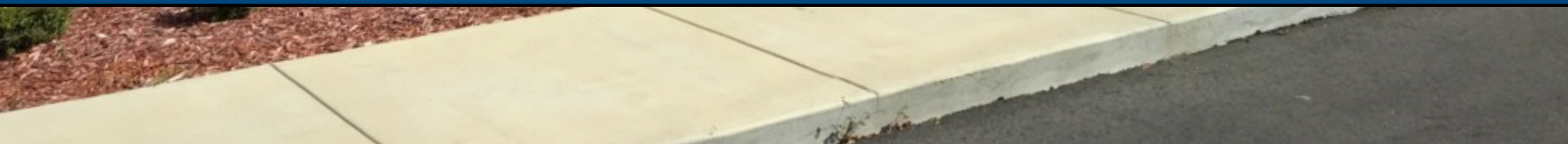

Expanding Workforce Programs

- TCC Quincy House
 - ▶ Opened in September, 2004
 - ▶ Housed computer lab and classroom
 - ▶ Hosted GED classes and after-school programs

Expanding Workforce Programs

- TCC Gadsden Center
 - ▶ Opened in March, 2016
 - ▶ Houses a computer lab, classrooms, HVAC lab and conference room
 - ▶ Hosts an industry-recognized certification program, GED/ESOL classes and expanded testing
 - ▶ Offers satellite support services for students

Closing the Gap

- Offering training requested by employers
 - ▶ HVAC
- Supporting the non-English speaking community
 - ▶ Bilingual staff and ESOL classes
- Eliminating transportation barriers
 - ▶ Ask the Expert Kiosk
 - Connecting prospective and current students with Admissions, Advising, Career Center, Financial Aid, Scholarships, Veterans Affairs and Cashier's Office from the TCC Gadsden Center

Extending Student Services

- Provides access to a computer lab and related resources
- Offers assistance with resume writing, job searches and submission of college and financial aid applications
- Hosts community resources, college admissions and advising services, proctored testing and business and community space
- Focuses programming on employers and workforce needs

First Year in Review

- Developed a comprehensive service delivery model that replicates the main campus environment and addresses transportation barriers
- Implemented GED, ESOL and HVAC programs that are at or near capacity
- Certified staff to address employer and student needs
- Expanded services to include a satellite GED location in Chattahoochee

In-Demand Programming

- Adult Education/GED
 - ▶ Day and evening programs
 - ▶ 27 students enrolled
- English for Speakers of Other Language
 - ▶ Day and evening programs
 - ▶ 18 students enrolled

In-Demand Programming

- English for Speakers of Other Languages student profile
 - ▶ Most are from Mexico and El Salvador
 - ▶ Most are seeking to improve their proficiency in English and secure a better paying job
 - ▶ Half are already employed

In-Demand Programming

- HVAC
 - ▶ Evening program
 - ▶ 1,350 clock hour program (approximately 5 semesters)
 - ▶ Currently 11 students enrolled
 - ▶ Key industry certifications
 - Occupational Safety and Health Administration 1926 10-hour Safety
 - Environmental Protection Agency Refrigeration
 - National Center for Construction and Education Research Core and Levels 1-4

In-Demand Programming

- HVAC student profile
 - ▶ All students are currently employed outside the field
 - ▶ Students' current jobs pay less than their projected placement wage after training
 - ▶ One budding entrepreneur
 - ▶ Two students travel 4 nights each week from Panama City and Perry to participate in training



In-Demand Programming

- Workplace safety workshop series
 - ▶ Quick workshops for local businesses and their employees that are free of charge
 - ▶ Workshop topics include first aid/CPR, active bystander and shooter training, cyber-security and continuity of operations planning
 - ▶ Safety Day
 - ▶ Supported by our partners
 - Capital Regional Medical Center
 - Medical Reserve Corps
 - TCC Emergency Management

Florida Highway Patrol Partnership

- Basic Recruit Class
 - ▶ Three classes administered simultaneously
 - ▶ Average recruit class is 50 students
 - ▶ Basic recruit program length is 7 months
 - ▶ Use classrooms, firearms and driving ranges and defensive tactics facilities - as well as Academy housing and dining services

Florida Highway Patrol Partnership

- High Speed Driving Track
 - ▶ Legislature appropriated \$4.5 million to fund construction of new track
 - ▶ No existing high speed driving track in Florida for public safety
 - ▶ Property has been identified at the Academy for construction



Florida Department of Corrections Partnership

- Correctional Probation Basic Recruit Class
 - ▶ Five classes administered simultaneously
 - ▶ Average recruit class is 40 students
 - ▶ Basic recruit program length is 4 months
 - ▶ Use classrooms, firearms and driving ranges and defensive tactics facilities - as well as Academy housing, dining services and FPSI Store

NASBLA Partnership

- National Association of State Boating Law Administrators training site
 - ▶ FPSI is 1 of only 2 training sites for NASBLA nationwide
 - ▶ Next year, FPSI will be the Association's only training site
 - ▶ NASBLA will locate a boat storage facility at the FPSI
 - ▶ Use classrooms, lakes, Academy housing and dining services

Federal Mine Safety and Health Grant

- Out of state training
 - ▶ Currently delivering training in 7 states (Georgia, Alabama, South Carolina, North Carolina, Kentucky, Virginia and Texas)
- Southeast Mine Safety and Health Conference Committee
 - ▶ Florida has never had a seat on the Committee
 - ▶ Kim Allen was selected to serve on the Federal Safety and Health Administration Committee
- Interstate Mining Compact Commission

Federal Mine Safety and Health Grant

- Surface Mine Search and Rescue Contest
 - ▶ Florida was approved to host by the U.S. Department of Labor
 - ▶ First of its kind in the southeastern United States
 - ▶ Event will take place across 3 days in March, 2018
 - ▶ Scenarios will be created and judged by the Federal Mine Safety and Health Administration
 - ▶ Rescue teams will come from across the United States to participate







Florida Public Safety Institute Housing

- Upgrades of original housing facility
 - ▶ Built in the early 1980s
 - ▶ 32 sleeping rooms (64 beds)
 - ▶ 16 bathrooms
 - ▶ Hallways
 - ▶ Common areas
 - ▶ Laundry room
