

Fundamentals of Search Warrants (Florida specific) Region III

This 24-hour course is designed to provide officers with an overview of search warrants and best practices for presenting evidence and how to structure their probable cause affidavit. A history of search warrant law will provide students with fundamental knowledge of the purpose and practicality of the search warrant. Practical applications of search warrants such as detention at the scene, exigency, curtilage, and informant confidentiality will be discussed. The course will conclude with search warrants writing exercises.
