a *message* from our president

This has been a year of tremendous momentum here at Tallahassee Community College.

We are growing our programs. We are expanding access to higher education into new markets. We are making big investments in critical areas that will directly benefit our students. What we've been able to accomplish as a team with the support of our community is truly remarkable. Here are just a few highlights.



- Strengthened our signature transfer programs with the establishment of a new Office of Transfer Services. The Office has three full-time positions and is located in the heart of campus in the Student Union.
- Became a charter school sponsor and helped to open a first-to-market high school. Tallahassee Collegiate Academy that is located on our campus and provides students the opportunity to earn a high school diploma at the same time they earn an associate degree in in-demand fields like cybersecurity, computer programming and web development, engineering technology, dental hygiene, and more.
- Started the process of adding an additional 32 new associate degree programs over the next two years in fields like game development, crime scene technology, and drones based on significant labor market demand.
- Launched Project Anchor in partnership with the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice to provide access to educational opportunities and case management services to justice-involved youth across the state of Florida.
- Expanded our nursing program for the third year in a row. Prior to the pandemic, we had about 150 students in the nursing program each year. For fall 2023, we will welcome 347 students, with another 130 coming in the spring.
- Established three new bachelor's degree programs in the critical fields of Elementary Education, Exceptional Student Education, and Business Administration.

Our impact is far greater today than ever before, and everyone is taking notice.

This year, we were recognized by Aspen Institute as a semifinalist for the Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence. We received the 2023 Award of Excellence for Student Success from the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) for our commitment and advancement of student success. We were named a top 10 finalist for the Bellwether College Consortium award for the second year in a row. We also were recognized as the first community college in the nation to be one of the Top 101 Best and Brightest Companies to Work For in the Nation by the National Association for Business Resources.

With new degree offerings, increased national recognition, and more than 60 percent of our students now coming to us from outside of our service district, we have begun exploring the potential of a name change to our institution. Your input in that process will be critical.

The successes we've achieved would not be possible without the support of donors like you. You are a valued stakeholder, and any decision that is made will be based on your feedback. I hope we can continue to rely on your support and leadership as we prepare to enter this exciting new chapter.

As always, thank you. Thank you for all that you do to make our College an amazing place for our students, faculty, staff and community.

We also continued our support of the College's Undergraduate Research Symposium, Black Male Achiever's Program, Sister to Sister Program, and Eagles Rise Summer Academy.

We created new partnerships with Amazon and the Loyalty Credit Union. Both will provide critical scholarships to our students in business and public safety sectors.

NEW SCHOLARSHIP

Irvine Leonard Welding Scholarship

After two years of retirement, Irvine became a construction/trades instructor at TCC's Division of Workforce Development. He served as a welding technology, plumbing, & OSHA (construction safety) instructor at TCC for 10 years between 2007 until he retired in 2017. He was indispensable in the growth of the construction-related training programs at TCC during his tenure at the College - especially the Welding Technology program.

Irvine worked tirelessly to develop the Welding program by taking it from a non-credit offering to a Career & Technical Education diploma program. The significance of this contribution cannot be understated given how it changed what the College is offering but more importantly how it changed students' lives. He also played an instrumental part in the development of the new, Welding Technology Lab located in the College's Kim B. Williams Advance Manufacturing Training Center in the design and required equipment to make the lab a state-of-the-art lab in the state of Florida. Additionally, he was a driving force in forging a critical partnership with the Jacksonville Plumbers & Pipefitters Joint Apprenticeship program, which resulted in the program being offered on TCC's campus in order to serve our local residents.

Irvine was a colleague who did not look for excuses why something could not be done but instead looked for creative ways to get things done! Putting those accolades aside - Irvine above all was a teacher. He touched his students' lives in so many positive ways. Prior to coming to TCC, he had been a licensed plumber & pipefitter journeyman and had served as the Business Manager for the Plumbers & Pipefitters Local Union 592. He brought that experience to TCC, which was invaluable in the classroom. He loved his craft and treated it as an art. He inspired and mentored his students preparing them for the world of work and creating those opportunities that were life-changing for his students.

Irvine passed away in May of 2022. To commemorate Irvine's legacy at TCC, his family and friends established the College's first scholarship dedicated to our welding program. The Irvine Leonard Welding Scholarship provides tuition assistance to students seeking a certificate in this program. We are grateful that his family chose TCC as a way to honor his legacy.

NEW SCHOLARSHIP

An Alumni Family Leaves a Legacy

The Cumbie Family from Gadsden County has a long history with Tallahassee Community College. Tom and Nesta Cumbie were married for 39 years. Combined, they shared six children – all of whom passed through the doors at TCC.

Tom served on the TCC Foundation Board of Directors for 12 years, including serving as the Board President from 2001 – 2002. He was inducted into the TCC Alumni & Friends Hall of Fame in 2016 to honor his service to the College. His daughter Pam Butler would follow in his footsteps in not only her service to the TCC Foundation Board – she served two terms as Board President in 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 - but also in being inducted into TCC's Alumni & Friends Hall of Fame in 2017. During her tenure as President of the Foundation, she led the efforts that raised over \$14.5 million in the TCC We Rise Campaign and helped launch the College's popular Cleaver and Cork Food & Wine Festival.

To honor their commitment to the College, we named an entrance to our Student Union the Tom and Nesta Cumbie Entrance in 2017 after Tom passed.

The Cumbie Family Scholarship will be allocated to students for the first time in Fall 2023 and will provide financial assistance to students seeking their CyberSecurity AS Degree from TCC.

Transfer Scholarships

Did you know that 74% of the students attending TCC seek to transfer to Florida State University to continue their education? Our Aspire program provides a seamless transfer for students who want to attend FSU, but also want a more personalized and affordable experience prior to transitioning fully to the university level.

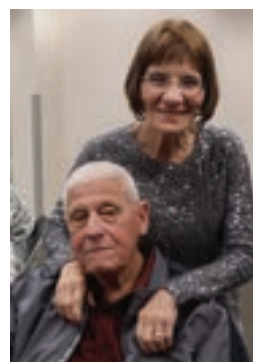
Just steps from FSU's campus, our students can live with FSU students in off-campus housing and have the opportunity to participate in FSU activities, all while earning their Associate in Arts degree and prerequisites for their undergraduate program at half the price of attending a university. TCC's Aspire program offers personalized advising, and electronic tools are utilized to help students understand appropriate classes that align with specifically intended majors at FSU. It also offers tuition assistance at TCC for those students enrolled in this program through two special scholarships.

ASPIRE SCHOLARSHIP

The first is our Aspire Scholarship. This scholarship was funded by private donors through the TCC Foundation, providing over \$100,000 this first year. Donors, who have asked to remain anonymous, were critical in creating this scholarship for our transfer students. The impact this has made for our Fall 2023 Aspire students has been astounding!

JIMMIE CALLAWAY SCHOLARSHIP

The second is our Jimmie Callaway Scholarship. Jimmie was linked to the Florida State football program as a ball boy, volunteer, and employee for 50-plus years. He had a deep and abiding love of all things Seminole! His wife Donna served as a member of the TCC District Board of Trustees for many years. Upon Jimmie's passing in 2020, Donna wanted to memorialize Jimmie's love of FSU and her love of TCC through this scholarship which provides support to students at TCC who seek to attend FSU.

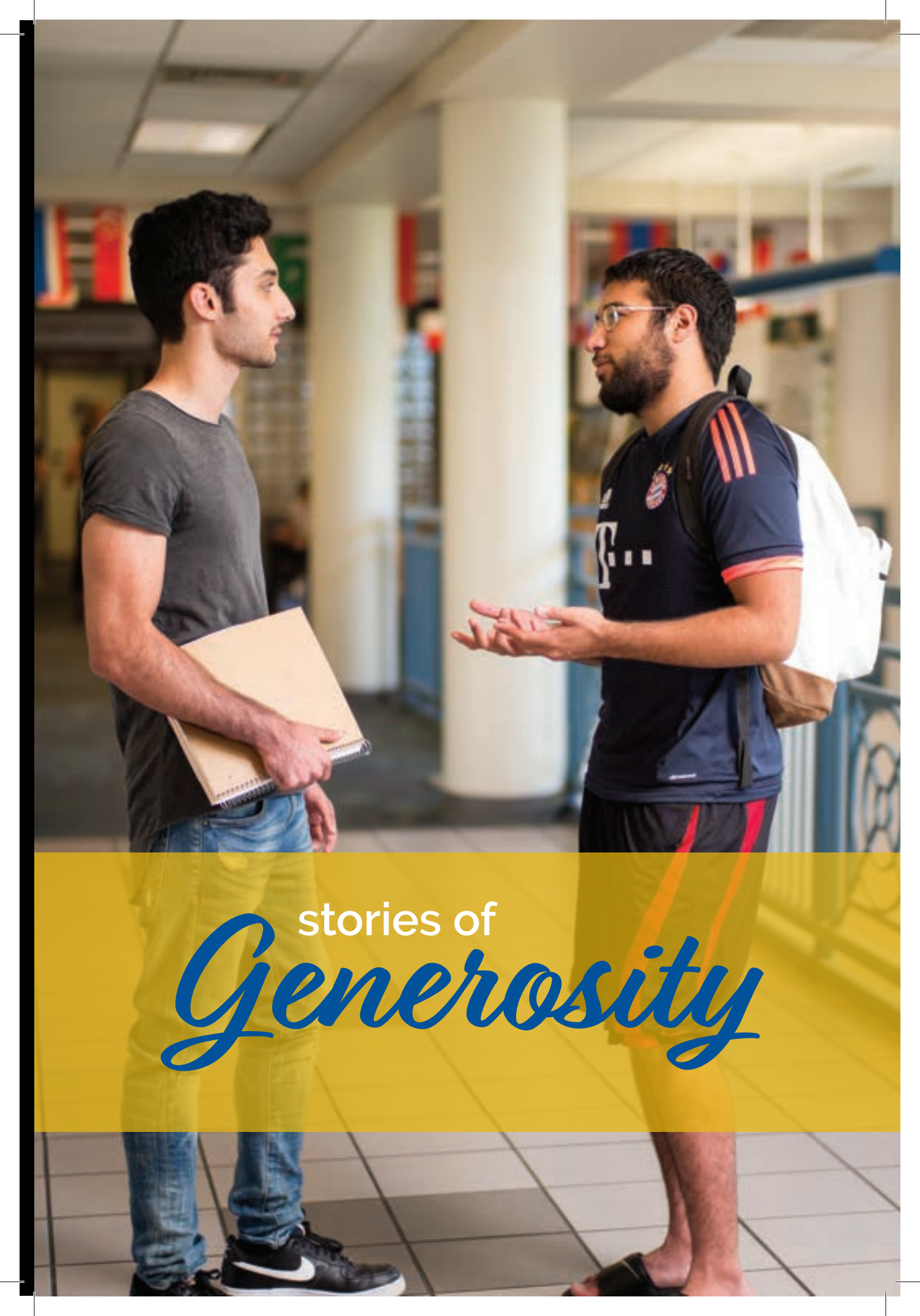

TCC Foundation Receives Donation from the Barbara Judd Trust

The Tallahassee Community College Foundation has received an \$88,000 donation from the Barbara Judd Trust for its Athletics Campaign.

Barbara Byers Judd, originally from New Haven, CT, earned degrees from Boston University and American University. She became a journalist and editor in Washington, DC. In 1975, she married Ted Judd, a pilot for Eastern Airlines. They moved to Tallahassee in 1990, having chosen a town that had "good sports, good theatre, interesting politics and four seasons, none of which was winter." Barbara passed away on February 26, 2022, at the age of 91.

The Judds touched the lives of so many people (and animals) in the Tallahassee area through their generosity of time, money, and spirit. She was a volunteer and supporter of organizations such as the Tallahassee Museum, Theatre Tallahassee, the Tallahassee Police Department, and Florida Wildlife Magazine. Barbara was a co-founder of the Democratic Club of North Florida and a member of the Leon County Democratic Executive Committee. She had a wall filled with cherished awards of appreciation for outstanding service from the many organizations she served – including the prestigious Silver Star Award from the Tallahassee Senior Center Foundation.

She loved TCC – especially our arts programs and our sports. Barbara was a long-time donor to the TCC Foundation, establishing a Theater Scholarship and supporting the renovation of a Theater Classroom.

"Barbara was such a great friend to Tallahassee Community College," said Heather Mitchell, Vice President for Institutional Advancement and Executive Director of the TCC Foundation. "She was invested in our work here at the College and loved hearing from our students. She attended many events on our campus and got engaged in our scholarship process. She will be missed, but her legacy will live on at TCC."

COLLEGE INNOVATION FUND

I AM Woman Conference

Each year, the Foundation, through the support of the President's Circle, funds grants through our College Innovation Fund.

The Foundation created the CIF Fund to assist faculty and staff in implementing transformational projects designed to develop student enrichment and innovation in the classroom and advance the college.

This year, we awarded a grant for the "I AM Woman Conference." The conference aimed to empower young female students across North Florida to connect, develop their academic voices, and grow as leaders. Dr. Sharisse Turner, Dean of Transitional Students and Coordinator of our Sister to Sister Program, created this conference to empower and uplift female college students, predominantly minority female students.

The conference occurred on March 31, 2023, and featured keynote speaker Tiffany Greene, ESPN Sports Commentator. We had over 156 attendees and over 20 local and regional organizations represented. The conference included a small business panel, a vendor fair, a fashion show, and breakout sessions. The breakout sessions focused on leadership, financial planning, health & wellness, business & entrepreneurship, global citizenship & public service, career pathways, and academic voice.

The conference's success is a testament to our faculty and staff's hard work to create opportunities for our students to learn and thrive in today's workforce.

Planned Giving Makes Impact

Amy Lynette Bailey passed away on April 9, 2011 at the age of 100. She was born in Bluffington, GA, on April 12, 1910. Miss Amy Bailey obtained a bachelor's degree from State Teachers College in Athens, Georgia, and a master's degree in Library Science from Louisiana State University. She worked as a librarian at Yakima Valley Junior College in the state of Washington. During her lifetime, Amy traveled the world, initially with college friends, and later in life using Elder Hostel programs. She retired in Tallahassee to be near her sister, Virginia Morton. Amy believed in clean and healthy living. Though she was not an early riser, at age 90, Amy set her alarm to get up at 6:30 a.m. in the morning to do the Body Electric exercises on television. She then went back to bed until a more respectable hour to get up.

Upon her death, Amy left TCC a gift of \$1,000,000. To our knowledge, she had never visited our campus, but clearly she knew of our work. Funds from this gift created the Amy Lynette Bailey Surgical Tech Program, scholarships for students, and support for our athletic facilities.

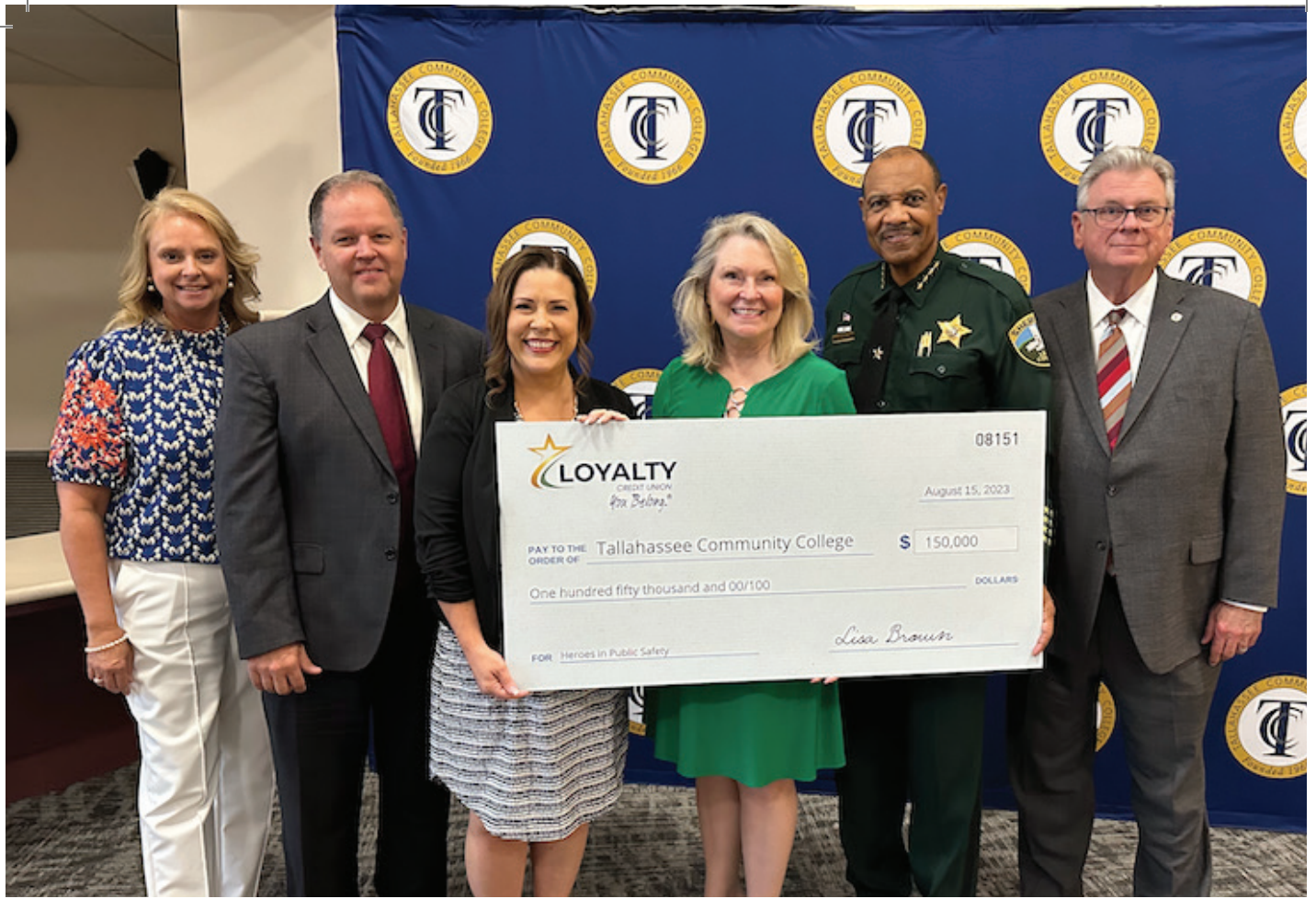

RECOGNIZING OUR PARTNERS

Loyalty Credit Union

In 2020, TCC launched the Heroes in Public Safety Program. In that time, this program has raised over \$200,000 to support a platform for cross-agency training and recruitment at TCC's Florida Public Safety Institute, and create scholarships for those seeking a career in the Public Safety Sector. In May 2023, Loyalty Credit Union connected with the TCC Foundation to enrich this funding with a donation of \$150,000 over the next five years to support scholarships for our students entering our Law Enforcement Program.

Loyalty Credit Union has been in business for over 60 years, and they serve Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, Walton, Washington, Bay, Calhoun, Gulf, Liberty, Franklin, Gadsden, and Duval County citizens. They recently came to Jefferson, Wakulla, and Leon County, merging with Tallahassee Leon Credit Union. The Tallahassee Leon Credit Union has long been a supporter of local law enforcement led by their President and CEO Lisa Brown. Amazon

Amazon announced they were coming to our community in late 2020. Located at I-10 and Mahan, their facility is a \$200 million, 2.8 million square foot robotics fulfillment center. From their support, the Foundation created the Amazon Business Scholarship for students entering TCC's newly created Business Management Bachelor Degree Program. Facility Renovations

Investing in Public Safety Sector Training

For many in public safety in the Big Bend, the road to their public safety career included study at Tallahassee Community College – the Florida Public Safety Institute (FPSI) and the Ghazvini Center for Health Care Education. FPSI houses the Pat Thomas Law Enforcement Academy and the Tallahassee Fire Academy. It also offers programs for correction officers, security officers, telecommunications, and a criminal justice online program. Specialty training programs include DUI and traffic safety training and mine safety and health training. The Ghazvini Center offers courses for Emergency Management Training (EMT).

In 2020, TCC launched the Heroes in Public Safety Program. The goal was to recognize our alumni in the Public Safety Sector, showcase our public safety programs, and raise funds for scholarships, equipment, and renovations for these programs. This past year, we were pleased to provide funding from our efforts to facilitate three critical renovations/updates!

DEFENSIVE TACTICS TRAINING ROOM

The first was an update to our Defensive Tactics (DT) Training Room. The DT room is critical in the curriculum for our fire programs and our law enforcement programs as it is ideal for dynamic simulation training. The room has a padded floor and padded walls to reduce injuries in training. But after decades of use, it was time to update this space, which is our most used space for these programs. By replacing the mats in our most utilized DT classroom we were able to repair the other three DT classrooms that had spots in them where the mats were torn or heavily worn. We now have four fully functioning DT mat classrooms. This project was a collaboration with the TCC Foundation, and the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission. This was a \$36,000 project.

CAMPUS FITNESS CENTER

The second renovation project was an update to our Campus Fitness Center. This project was a collaboration with the TCC Foundation, the Highway Patrol, and Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission. A needs assessment was completed last fall, and it was determined that we needed to replace several pieces of equipment. We also wanted to add a double glass door to give access to our outdoor CrossFit area. This was a \$40,000 project.

DEFENSIVE DRIVING TRACK

The final project these funds supported was the repaving of our TCC Defensive Driving Track at our Florida Public Safety Institute (FPSI) Campus. This track is used by over 62 agencies that train at FPSI. Traffic safety is paramount, and this track provides a safe space for training for both cars and motorcycles. Classes taught in this space include traffic homicide investigation, crash scene mapping, speed measurement, control of your vehicle and safe operation at high speeds. This was a \$30,000 project.

Grants & Special Projects

It was another historic year for the Office of Grants and Special Projects with over \$11.4 million of successful funding spread out over 29 awards. Some grant highlights include:

An award of \$1.6 million from the Florida Job Growth Grant Fund for our healthcare programs. This was funding for new equipment, including our simulation lab to prepare students for Dental Hygiene, Dental Assisting and Surgical Technology for employment opportunities upon successful completion of the respective certification exams.

An award of \$420,000 from the US Department of Agriculture to support our Small Plot Farming program at Wakulla Environmental Institute. This grant will offer scholarships and tool kits for underrepresented minority students to have the basic skills and tools needed to allow them to be successful entering the workforce and/or in developing their own small farm business.

TCC was awarded \$825,607 from the state of Florida for the Pipeline Nursing Grant and \$290,000 for the Line Nursing Grant. Half of that \$290,000 included \$20,000 from TMH and \$125,000 from HCA. These monies are being used for scholarships, equipment, and training costs for our healthcare programs.

We received an award of \$100,000 from Bank of America to support our brand-new Building Automation System AS degree program. This funding will allow us to purchase new equipment needed for this program. Bank of America continues to be a wonderful and strong community partner for all of our programs at TCC.
